Dear Church Family,

The year 2020 has been very strange and unique for us all. First off, it was the COVID-19 Pandemic, which isn't over yet. Then, following the murder of George Floyd, we have been now dealing with racism, as you have seen it in the news. Since, in this article, I only focus on racism, let me say that the organization that can help address racism and any forms of discrimination is the Church. You and I are, therefore, the ones God would like to use to do it.

Whether you agree with what you see in the news or not, we still have work to do together, as a Church and a community. To do so, we have to use the following foundation, which offers us a framework to fight racism and all other forms of discrimination:

- → God created us all in God's image. See Genesis 1.
- → We all have the same parents. See Genesis 1:28, 3:20, 9:1, and Acts 17:26.
- → In God's eyes we are all equal. See Galatians 3: 28, and Colossians 3: 11.
- → God wants us to love all people, and do it unconditionally. See Leviticus 19: 34, and James 2:9.

Of course, you may have read or heard of the above. But, what matters is what you and I do about it. How we use these principles is what changes us and the people in our community. Apply the above framework to our daily lives will surely transform our society and help us fight against racism and any form of discrimination. The following lines suggest three ways you could do it.

#### **Start with Prayer**

It's important to pray asking God to help us. Our human nature has already set us up for harm, injustice, discrimination, and disobedience to God's word as laid out (see framework above). Prayer helps us reconnect with the original image of God that we, unfortunately, lose every time we disconnect from God through sin (Romans 3:24, and 1 John 3:4).

#### **Choose to Learn about Other People**

The willingness to learn about other people's culture helps us appreciate our racial diversity and cultural differences, as a people. Being a minority in Lake Park, I am a perfect example for this. I have a very different worldview because I am black, French speaking, and have lived in the Congo, and Zimbabwe prior to immigrating to the U.S. I am not the only minority, there are also two Haitians, an African American, and a few Hispanics. If you do not do it with any of them, reach out to me. I will be glad to talk to you about who I am, my experience as a black man with an accent living in the U.S. I will have questions for you too.

#### Say "NO" to Racism

Join others to condemn racism and all forms of discrimination. A friend of mine sent me this text last week,

I have been wondering how you are doing with your congregation in light of recent events surrounding racism?

Are you receiving racist comments? With this being at the forefront, even with me being white, I have heard disappointing comments from people. I just wouldn't have heard their hearts on the topic otherwise.

A lot of times, people do not go to the concerned individual to tell them what they feel about them. But, with people who look like them, people talk because they are comfortable with each other. Now, and in your specific group, *what have you heard? Has what you heard been racist or discriminatory? And, what have you done about it?* 

*My encouragement for us all today is to speak up against racism and any type of discrimination.* Let your family and friends know that you are not racist. And, one way to do it is to condemn every racist word and comments in your family, community, at a restaurant, in your workplace, on social media, etc.

Unlike the everyday now-I-lay-me-down-to-sleep kind of prayer, this was a prayer birthed under heartache...grief...desperation. It was a plea for Heaven to move and change his nation."\*

O God, our Father, help us realize that we all have the same parents. We would like to love and appreciate each other, no matter where we are from, how we talk, and how we look. We can do this through Jesus Christ who strengthens and enables us to fight against racism and every other type of discrimination. In his name, we pray. Amen.
